RASH HALL RENOVATIONS: Last Sunday we mentioned renovations that we would like to do in Rash Hall.

Several items were included but when the contractor's bid came back at almost \$400,000 for all of them we decided to consider only a few at this time and do the others later. The items that are first on our list include

- * renovating the restrooms in the west hallway between the kitchen and the parlor to make them attractive and handicap accessible.
- opening a doorway on the west side of Rash Hall to make these restrooms more accessible.
- enclosing the hallway between the Resource room and Rash Hall to provide storage for the tables, chairs, and other items stored in Rash Hall.
- * opening a doorway on the east side of Rash Hall to provide access to this storage closet.
- making a new doorway from the Resource room into the courtyard hallway.

The contractor's bid for these items is about \$93,000. We felt much more comfortable with this amount. We would love to have any input or suggestions you have regarding this project.
